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DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Restraints

DO NOT exceed 25mL injection site volume for cattle

DO NOT exceed 10mL injection site volume for pigs or sheep.

Contraindications

This product is contraindicated in horses during concomitant therapy with corticosteroids.

DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION USE ALL PRODUCT WITHIN 4 WEEKS OF OPENING.

Please refer to leaflet for dose table for each species.

1. 24 hours dose regimen

Give once daily by injection by the route recommended for the species as per the dosing table in leaflet. Care is needed when calculating small dose rates for dogs, cats and young animals. A temporary swelling at the injection site after administration to horses may sometimes be noticed.

2. For long acting mode of action

Injection should be given in the neck region. Give by intramuscular injection in the neck only (cattle, sheep and pigs only), repeat after 2 days, if required.

The maximum recommended dose at any one

Adult cattle: 25mL Pigs: 10mL Sheep: 10mL

Injection by all normal parenteral routes. Intravenous injections (horses, cattle and sheep only) must be given slowly over a period of at least one minute. When required, dilution with saline or distilled water is satisfactory, in such cases the solution should be used immediately. Dilution with calcium salts is not recommended as this may lead to precipitation of crystals which makes the solution unsuitable for intravenous use. For long acting dose (cattle, sheep and pigs only) give an intramuscular injection, and repeat after 2 days if required.

DISPOSAL

Dispose of empty container by wrapping with paper and putting in garbage.

STORAGE

Store below 25°C (Air conditioning). Do not freeze. Protect from light. When kept at the recommended storage temperatures, the product remains stable for 14 days after first broaching of the container.
